

Clarkson's captain **Nick Dodge** scored a goal for his 100th career point and then set-up the game-winner to help the Knights win their home-opener with a 2-1 overtime victory against UMass (10/12).

A four-goal outburst in the first period started off the 2007-08 campaign in the right fashion for Clarkson in exhibition play. Last year's ECAC Hockey Tournament MOP, Chris D'Alvise led a balanced scoring effort with one goal and one assist. Nine different Knights recorded at least one point, including five different goal scorers. D'Alvise opened the scoring three minutes in followed by first-period goals from Scott Freeman, Tyrell Mason, and Mike Arciero. Grant Clitsome added the Knights' second power-play marker of the game early in the middle frame. Shea Guthrie posted two assists. David Leggio started in goal and posted eight saves on nine shots through 30:35 of play. Tim Potter made 18 saves, including 13 in the third period, while allowing one goal.

In the first official NCAA hockey game of the season, Clarkson and St. Lawrence put on an exciting show for a national TV audience on ESPNU, and the sellout crowd at Appleton Arena with the Saints finally prevailing for the one-goal win. The Knights, who held a 1-0 lead late in to the second period, surrendered three straight to the Saints to fall into a two-goal deficit midway through the third period. Late in the final frame, Clarkson pulled to within one when Matt Beca knocked in a backhand shot at 16:27. Linemates Steve Zalewski and Tim Marks assisted Clarkson had a late power play, but could not come up with the equalizer. One of the Knights' top rookies and a veteran All-American combined for the game's first goal with just 1:33 remaining in the opening period. Freshman Scott Freeman set up Nick Dodge's 41st career goal and 99th career point. St. Lawrence, which had 15 shots on goal in the second period, finally got on the scoreboard with 4:32 left in the middle frame. The Saints then took the lead at 9:21, connecting on a 3-on-2 rush, and went up 3-1 four minutes later with another goal off a faceoff. Both goaltenders seemed in mid-season form with David Leggio making 27 saves, including 14 stops in the second period.

Game #2 (October 12, 2007) - Att: 2,560 Cheel Arena, Potsdam, NY Final Score: CLARKSON 2 - UMass 1 OT

Nick Dodge scored a goal for his 100th career point and then set-up the game winner to help Clarkson to the overtime win in its home opener. In a rematch of last year's NCAA East Regional opening-round game, Clarkson gained a measure of revenge by handing the Minutemen the overtime defeat. Last March, UMass dealt the Knights a 1-0 overtime loss. Fifty-nine seconds into Friday's extra session, Dan Tuttle took a pass from Dodge at the left circle and fired off a quick shot to start the Knights' first celebration of the year. David Cayer also assisted, starting the rush on the deciding goal. A lengthy scoring drought against the Minutemen came to a close for Clarkson early in the third as the Knights tied the game 1-1. Fifty-three seconds into the period, Dodge connected off a pass from Steve Zalewski for his second goal of the season and 42nd career tally. Cayer picked up his first assist of the game on the power-play goal, which snapped a scoreless stretch of 118:43 against UMass. After a scoreless first period, the Minutemen took the lead at 13:45 of the second. The Knights out shot the Minutemen 33-19. David Leggio posted 18 stops, including nine over the opening 20 minutes. Clarkson was 1-of-5 on the power play and killed off both UMass man-advantage opportunities.

A two-goal first-period effort was all the scoring the Golden Knights would need as they held off Providence behind the solid goaltending of David Leggio. Leggio picked up his fourth career shutout behind a 28-save performance as Clarkson, completed the weekend sweep of Hockey East foes at Cheel. Ranked 13th in the nation, Clarkson jumped out to a quick start, scoring 2:47 after the opening faceoff. Shea Guthrie started off the scoring, lifting in a backhand shot to finish off a breakaway for his first goal of the season. Dan Tuttle sent Guthrie in on the breakaway with a pass from center ice. Freshman Lauri Tuohimaa also assisted for his first collegiate point. The Knights made it 2-0, at 15:47, when Matt Beca knocked down a pass in front of the Providence goal and slipped a pass around a Friar defenseman to Steve Zalewski, who knocked in a shorthanded tally for his first goal of the year. Providence picked up its play over the final 40 minutes, outshooting the Green and Gold 19-10 in the final two periods, but Leggio, last season's ECAC Goaltender of the Year, was on top of his game turning aside all of the Friars' chances. For the game, Providence held a 28-20 shot advantage. Both teams were 0-of-3 on the power play.

Five different Golden Knights scored goals, capped off by Chris D'Alvise's overtime game-winner, a powerplay marker at 1:26, as Clarkson overcame an early deficit to gain a thrilling win in the opening contest of the ECAC Hockey campaign. St. Lawrence, which held a 3-0 first-period lead, fell behind 4-3 late in the third before tying it with 37 seconds left in regulation after the Saints pulled the goaltender for the extra attacker. St. Lawrence gained the early momentum with three straight goals to hold a 3-0 first-period lead. With five minutes left in the second stanza, Clarkson got on the scoreboard when freshman defenseman Tom Pizzo scored his first collegiate goal to give the Knights life. Clarkson continued to gain the momentum in the third, and struck for three straight goals to take the lead. Tim Marks tallied a power-play marker at 1:46. Steve Zalewski followed at 13:13 and freshman Lauri Tuohimaa put the Green and Gold on top for the first time in the game at 14:41. Clarkson held a 34-27 advantage in shots. Leggio improved his record against St. Lawrence to 4-1 with a 23-save effort.

A complete 60-minute effort, featuring two goals in both the first and third periods, and a solid effort in goal by David Leggio lifted Clarkson to its first road win of the season. Leggio came through with his second shutout in the first five games of the season, and fifth career whitewash, with a 19-save effort, including eight stops in the second period. Steve Zalewski, with a 5-on-3 power-play goal, and Lauri Tuohimaa provided all the scoring the Knights would need in the first period. After several excellent scoring opportunities came up short for the Green and Gold in a scoreless second period, Clarkson sealed the win a pair of specialty-team goals over the final 20 minutes. Nick Dodge tallied unassisted on a slap shot from along the right boards for his sixth career shorthanded marker at 6:26. Chris D'Alvise, who also recorded an assist in the victory, closed out the scoring with his second goal of the season, a power-play marker at 12:41. Grant Clitsome recorded his second assist of the game. Clarkson posted 25 shots on goal, while allowing a season low 19 shots. The Knights finished 2-of-7 on the power play, while Lake Superior failed in five man-advantage attempts.

The first career hat trick from Tim Marks helped Clarkson extend its home unbeaten streak to 18 consecutive games (14-0-4), including five straight wins this season. Trailing 2-0 midway through the first, the Knights ran off four unanswered goals to take control with a 4-2 lead after 40 minutes of play. Marks put Clarkson on the scoreboard at 13:12, putting in a rebound off of **Matt Beca**'s attempt. The Knights hit stride in the middle frame with three more goals. David Cayer tied the game with a slap shot from the top of the right circle at 2:08. Marks completed his hat trick, scoring twice in a span of 4:18. At 9:15, Marks flipped in a shot for a power-play goal to put Clarkson in the lead. In a rematch of last year's ECAC Hockey Tournament championship game, Quinnipiac gained a measure of revenge by handing the Green and Gold their first conference loss of the season. Tied 1-1 through 40 minutes, the Bobcats out scored the Knights 2-1 in the final frame, with the game-winner on the power play with less than six minutes to play. Quinnipiac took a 1-0 lead late in the first before Clarkson tied it up midway through the second when Chris D'Alvise finished off a perfect feed in front from **Shea Guthrie** for his third goal of the year at 11:15. Lauri Tuohimaa also assisted. At 6:26 of the final frame, the Bobcats regained the lead, 2-1, but Clarkson came back with a goal by David Caver to even the score with under 10 minutes to play. Scott Freeman found Cayer all alone in the slot where the senior fired a quick turnaround shot into the back of the net for his third goal of the year. 

David Leggio backboned a stingy defensive effort and David Cayer and Shea Guthrie provided timely goals as Clarkson recorded its first win in NCAA Tournament play in 12 years. After a scoreless first period, St. Cloud took the opening lead early in the second frame with its lone goal at 4:08. The Knights answered back late in the period to make it 1-1 through 40 minutes. Cayer knocked in a rebound off of freshman defenseman Bryan Rufenach's shot from the point. Missed opportunities hampered Clarkson's bid to knock off top-ranked Michigan as the Wolverines held the Golden Knights off the scoreboard en route to a 2-0 victory. The number-one seed in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, Michigan earned the right to advance to the Frozen Four in Denver, CO on April 10 and 12. Clarkson, coming off its first tournament victory in 12 years with Friday's 2-1 win over St. Cloud, came out strong against Michigan.
